

The regular meeting of the Huntingdon County Commissioners was held on the above date and time in the Commissioner's Meeting Room with the following present: Commissioners Sather and Walls; Solicitor, Larry Newton; Chief Clerk, Heather Fellman; Planning Director, Jim Lettiere; CYS Director, Kelvin Abrashoff; Daily News Reporter, Joe Thompson and guests, Curt McConaughy and Joan Rogers

No one attended via GoToMeeting.

The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by Commissioner Sather. Prayer was led by Commissioner Walls and the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag was led by Commissioner Sather.

It was moved by Commissioner Walls, seconded by Commissioner Sather and carried (Sather, yes; Walls, yes) to approve the minutes of the previous meeting.

It was moved by Commissioner Walls, seconded by Commissioner Sather and carried (Walls, yes; Sather, yes) to approve payment of bills.

There were no additions to the agenda.

Under announcements, Commissioner Walls commented that there is grant money for Start Up Alleghenies administered through HCBi. They are starting a new online marketing program similar to Ebay, Etsy and Amazon. The fees are 45% less than Amazon, 26% less than Etsy and 40% less than Ebay. If you want more information on how to get your business online, contact HCBi. Half of the processing fees collected go back into advertising to promote your business. Local business owners should take advantage of this opportunity. Commissioner Sather reminded residents of the hidden gems in our own community that they can explore this summer. He encouraged residents to visit Isetts Museum, Swagart's Museum, Lincoln Caverns, and the East Broad Top Railroad.

Under new business, Kelvin Abrashoff, CYS Director, requested consideration of approval to attend the Crimes Against Children conference in Dallas, Texas. He has received a scholarship to pay for his accommodations, airfare and the conference fee. It was moved by Commissioner Walls, seconded by Commissioner Sather and carried (Sather, yes; Walls, yes).

Consideration of approval was given to hire Matthew Lindsey for the position of Veterans Services Officer in the Veterans Affairs Department effective June 26, 2023. It was moved by Commissioner Walls, seconded by Commissioner Sather and carried (Walls, yes; Sather, yes).

Jim Lettiere, Planning Director, requested consideration of approval for the 2023 Broad Top Act 13 Marcellus Shale Legacy Funding Grant Agreement. This funding will be used for upgrades to the Borough Council Building. The total cost of the project is \$10,792.83. The Borough Council will put in \$1,400. It was moved by Commissioner Walls, seconded by Commissioner Sather and carried (Sather, yes; Walls, yes).


There were no Matters for Action.
