

The regular weekly meeting of the Huntingdon County Commissioners was held on the above date and time in the Commissioners meeting room with the following being present: Commissioners O’Korn, Fluke and Thomas; Chief Clerk, Michelle Cerett; Solicitor, Pete McManamon; Daily News Reporter Zach Myers and visitors Jim Cassatt and Bruce Pergament.

The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by Commissioner O’Korn followed by prayer led by Commissioner Fluke and the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag led by Commissioner Thomas.

It was moved by Commissioner Fluke, seconded by Commissioner Thomas and carried (O’Korn, yes; Fluke, yes; Thomas, yes) to approve the minutes of the August 12th public meeting.

It was moved by Commissioner Thomas, seconded by Commissioner Fluke and carried (Fluke, yes; Thomas, yes; O’Korn, yes) to approve the payment of bills.

There were no additions to the agenda, items addressed by the Solicitor or public comments today.

Commissioner Thomas reminded residents to watch for school buses with the start of the new school year. Commissioner O’Korn congratulated Adam Miller and everyone involved in this year’s LEPC Summit.

First on the agenda today was consideration of the fuel oil bids that were opened last week. After discussion, it was moved by Commissioner Thomas, seconded by Commissioner Fluke and carried (Thomas, yes; O’Korn, yes; Fluke, yes) to award the bid to Alexandria Energy for a variable rate of \$.17 above the previous day rack price.

It was moved by Commissioner Fluke, seconded by Commissioner Thomas and carried (O’Korn, yes; Fluke, yes; Thomas, yes) to approve the attendance of the County Auditors at the annual conference for a total cost of \$435.00 per person.

There were two county veteran burial allowances and installation of one Government headstone for approval today.

There being no further business, it was moved by Commissioner Thomas to adjourn the meeting at 9:43 a.m.
