The regular weekly meeting of the Huntingdon County Commissioners was held on the above date in the Commissioners Meeting Room with the following being present: Commissioners Kough Pittenger, Hoover, and Fluke; Chief Clerk, Michelle Cerett; Solicitor, Peter McManamon; George Germann, The Daily News; Planning Director, Richard Stahl; Planning Intern, Michelle Krug; Ann Foor; Celina Seftas, PA Clean Ways; and visitors Bruce Pergament, Joan and Jim Cassett.

The meeting was called to order at 9:31 a.m. by Chairman Kough Pittenger followed by Prayer led by Commissioner Kough Pittenger and the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag led by Michelle Cerett.

There were no additions or corrections to the July 13th minutes.

It was moved by Commissioner Hoover second by Commissioner Fluke and carried (Kough Pittenger, yes; Hoover, yes; Fluke, yes) to approve the minutes of the July 13th meeting.

It was moved by Commissioner Fluke second by Commissioner Hoover and carried (Hoover, yes; Kough Pittenger, yes; Fluke, yes) to approve payment of invoices for the week of July 19th

There was one addition to the agenda today. Commissioner Hoover would like to talk about a Highway safety issue.

There was no public comment on the agenda today.

There were no public comments today.

First on the agenda was Richard Stahl with a request for signature on an administrative agreement allocating CDBG funds to the Dudley, Carbon, Coalmont Joint Authority. It was moved by Commissioner Hoover, second by Commissioner Fluke and carried (Fluke, yes; Kough Pittenger, yes; Hoover, yes) to approve \$73,500 from the CDBG grant to the Dudley, Carbon, Coalmont Joint Authority for the study of a comprehensive upgrade to their water supply.

Richard also presented an Administrative agreement for the Neighborhood Stabilization program Grant. There are three agreements to be entered into with Mapleton Borough for the rehabilitation of two properties in the Borough of Mapleton.

It was moved by Commissioner Hoover, second by Commissioner Fluke and carried (Kough Pittenger, yes; Hoover, yes; Fluke, yes) to enter into the three additional agreements for the Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

Richard provided an update on the ratification of the Solid Waste plan. The plan successfully ratified with 95% of the population and 91.6% of the number of municipalities ratifying the plan. A letter will now be sent to DEP certifying the ratification of the plan.

Next on the agenda was the adoption of resolution #14-2010.

The resolution recognizes and congratulates Richard Stahl on serving as the County Planner for 30 consecutive years. It was moved by Commissioner Hoover, second by Commissioner Fluke and carried (Hoover, yes; Fluke, yes; Kough Pittenger, yes) to adopt Resolution #14-2010.

Celina Seftas was last on the agenda with information on the illegal dump site survey that was completed recently. The results will be publically released on Friday July 23rd, 2010.

The survey revealed several illegal dumpsites throughout Huntingdon County.

Commissioner Hoover relayed some information to the public from the transportation meeting last week. He asked that the public be aware of and abide by the speed limits in construction zones.

The Commissioners approved payment of 1 private headstone, and 2 burial allowances.

There being no further business, it was moved by Commissioner Hoover second by Commissioner Fluke and carried to adjourn the meeting at 10:35 a.m. Minutes prepared by Chief Clerk, Michelle Cerett.
