The American Community Survey (ACS) is a determining factor in eligibility for a project to be completed using CDBG funds. A community-wide project must be at least 51% LMI

While the highlighted areas are considered as a community-wide LMA (low/moderate income area) they are NOT automatically approved for any or all projects.

While the non-highlighted areas are above the LMI threshold, but does NOT exclude them from being approved for a project.

The higher the percentage, the more low/moderate income persons reside in the designated area.

A specific section or portion of the borough/township can be qualified for portions or area specific projects while the entire community isn't.

Some exclusions apply based upon beneficiaries and/or nature of the project

If you are a local government, non-profit or community organization and have a project in mind for your community follow the guidelines below:
